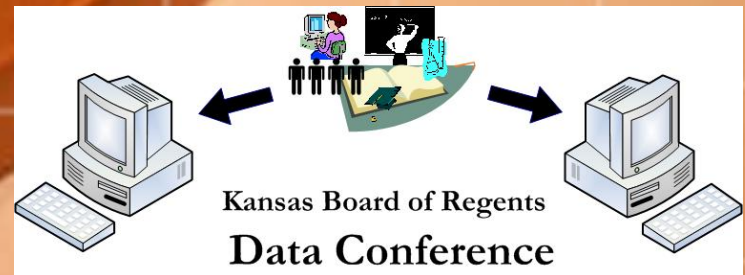

Purposes of Program Inventory

- Provide a centralized list accessible by KBOR institutions, KBOR staff, and public constituents of academic programs offered at each public institution.
- Facilitate the maintenance (e.g., addition, modifying, deletion, etc.) of academic programs at all public institutions via the web-based system; maintain programmatic history

Purposes of Program Inventory (cont'd)

- Provide an expedited and convenient method of tracking new academic programs through the KBOR approval process.

Use of Program Inventory by Institutions

- View KBOR approved programs
- Add, modify, split, or merge Programs
- View program approval process
- Maintain programmatic histories

Definition of Program

“Program” means an academic plan that is approved by the appropriate governing board and leads to an award, for example, a degree or a career/technical certificate

(KBOR Policy manual, pg 26)

What to include in Program Inventory?

- **State Universities-**

- all recognized and approved degree programs

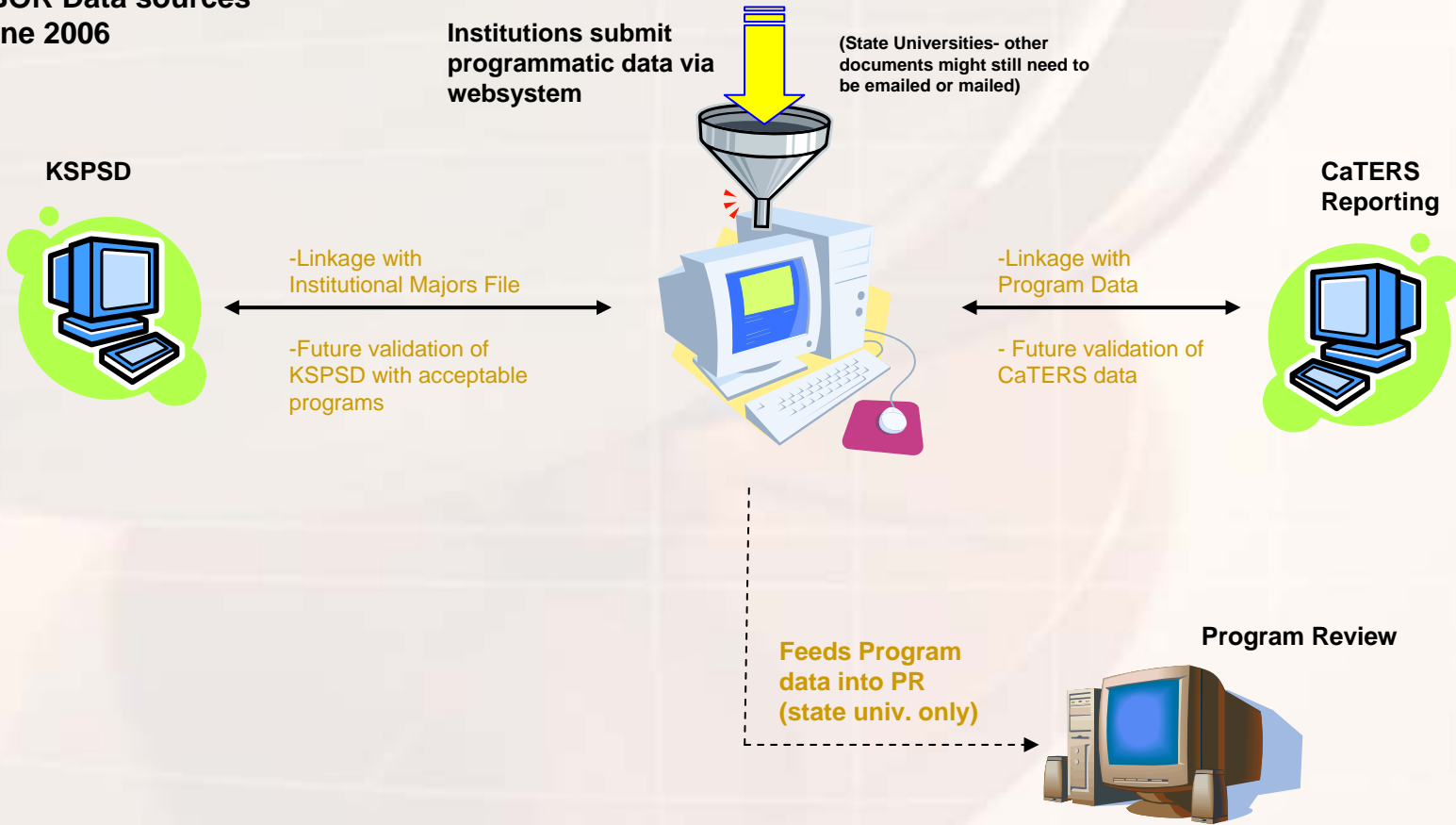
- **Community Colleges and Technical Institutions**

- Board recognized and approved associate degree programs
- Board recognized and approved certificate programs over 16 hours; certificates are defined in the CC regulations.

Linkages of Program Inventory to other KBOR data

- Linkage with KSPSD data
- Linked data with CaTERs reports
- Feed program data into Program Review (state universities only)

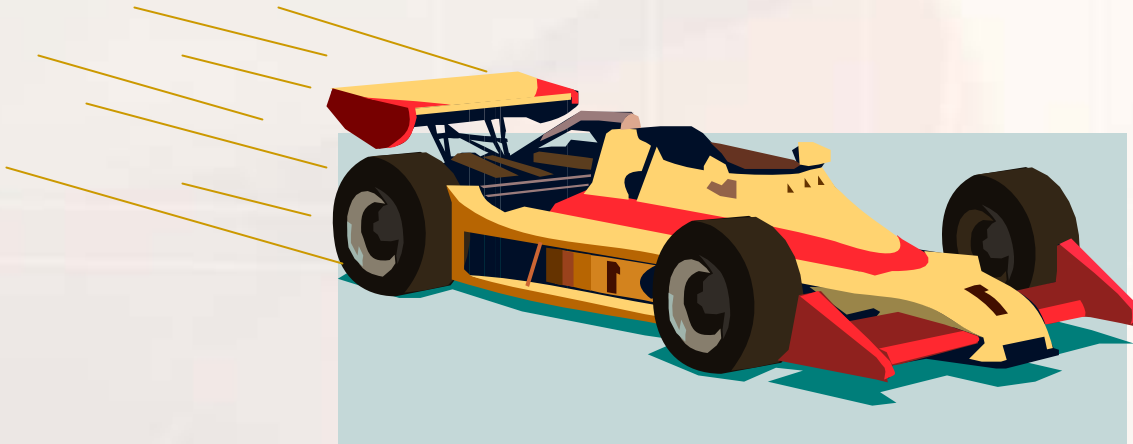
**Program Inventory Linkages to other

Program Inventory deadlines

- The deadlines for submitting new academic programs for community colleges remain the same, February 13 and August 13.
- Public universities do not have a deadline for submitting new academic programs. They can be submitted at any time during the year and will flow into the approval process once all required paperwork has been submitted and received by KBOR.
